COVID-19 (CORONAVIRUS) Statistics

The latest statistics from Scottish Government, dated up to 14 October 2020 (week 1 - week 41 of the pandemic) show that 1578* East Dunbartonshire residents had tested positive for Covid-19 infection and that, unfortunately, 139** local people have died, where Covid-19 has been identified as the principle or as a contributing cause.

The East Dunbartonshire Public, Service User and Carer (PSUC) group thank the local residents, Patients, Service Users and Carers, who, for the most, have responded quickly and positively to the Scottish Governments lockdown guidance and observed social distancing.

Your individual and collective efforts have helped to keep the spread of this virus to a relatively low rate and we ask that you continue to follow the advice and guidance issued by the Scottish Government.

The East Dunbartonshire 7 day statistics show that there have been 284* positive cases (19 to 25 October 2020) which is a rate of 261.4 per 100,000 population.

NHS GGC / PODIATRY UPDATE

Podiatry services across NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde (NHS GGC) have begun returning to normal service, this was done by using a phased approach which prioritised patients depending on clinical requirements. Alongside emergency footcare treatment, which continued throughout the pandemic, the service is now inviting <u>existing patients</u> who would normally attend every four weeks, to return for their regular treatment. These patients will be contacted directly and offered an appointment.

<u>New patients</u> will receive a telephone consultation to identify their foot problem. From that consultation, they may be offered advice, a 'Near Me' video consultation or face-to-face treatment if required. Existing patients who would normally attend the service between every five and eight weeks, will now be invited to return to for regular treatments. Where the capacity is available, treatment for those existing patients who normally receive consultations every nine – 16 weeks will recommence.
